

Professor Andrew Brown FIEE SMIEEE FBCS CEng EurIng CITP became Head of the Design Automation research group in Electronics at the University of Southampton in the UK in 1993, building it up over the next fifteen years from one of the smallest groups (three academic staff) to the largest engineering group (thirteen academic staff, over 70 people all told) in what was then the largest University Department of Electronics in the UK. He has been an investigator on numerous research projects and a founding director of three spin-out companies (Horus Systems, LME Design Automation and ECSPartners), attracting over £1M of VC capital. In 2002 he was awarded a Royal Society Industrial Fellowship. He has held visiting chair appointments at the University of Trondheim (Norway), University of Cambridge (UK) and Ecole Polytechnique Federale Lausanne - **EPFL** (Switzerland), and has held Visiting Scientist appointments at IBM Hursley (UK) and at MAC Communications (UK) under aegis of the UK government Visiting Academic in Industry scheme. He has taken leading roles in the UK Engineering Research Council microelectronics 'Grand Challenge' programme and the subsequent eFutures network activities. He has served on numerous conference organising and programme committees, and is an Associate Editor of Electronics Letters.
